



Directions to Maple Wind Farm Huntington Vermont

From New York City and Points West and South

(Driving time from New York City is approximately 6 hours. From Albany -3 hours)
Take **I-87 North** to Albany, NY. Continue on I-87 (the Northway) from Albany to **Exit 20** (Whitehall, NY Rte. 149). Take **LEFT** off exit ramp onto **Route 149 North & East**. Follow Rte. 149 to Whitehall, NY. In Whitehall, take **U.S. Route 4 East** (signs to Fair Haven, Rutland, VT). Follow **Route 4 East** (in NY the signs say Route 4 North) to Fair Haven, VT. In Fair Haven, take **Exit 2** onto **Route 22A North**. In approx. 35 miles, turn **RIGHT** on **Route 17 East** in Addison. Follow Rt. 17 to the town of Bristol (13 miles). At the traffic light in town, continue straight on Rt. 17/Rt. 116 North. In 3 miles, turn **RIGHT** to continue on **Rte. 17 East**. In approximately 6 miles, turn **LEFT** to Huntington onto **Gore Rd.** at the sign "**Hanksville and Huntington.**" In 2.8 miles, turn **RIGHT** onto- dirt **Carse Rd.** At the intersection (1/4 mile), turn right and a quick **LEFT** up **Carse Rd.** *On The Loose* is at the end of the road (1 mile) on the right before the big Red Barn. Please park in the area to the right between the office/house and telephone pole (not next to the house-tenant parking).

From Boston and Rhode Island , and other points Southeast

(Driving time from Boston is approximately 4 hours.)
Take **I-93 North** to **I-89 North** just before Concord, NH. Follow I-89 North to **Exit 11** in Richmond, VT. Turn **LEFT** off the exit and follow **Rt. 2 East** to town of Richmond (2 miles). Follow below directions from Richmond *.

From Burlington, VT, Montreal and Points North

(Driving time from Burlington is approximately 40 minutes.)
Take **I-89 South** to **Exit 11** in Richmond, VT. Turn **RIGHT** off the exit and follow **Rt. 2 East** to town of Richmond (2 miles). Follow below directions from Richmond *.

*From town of Richmond

At the traffic light (Cumberland Farms gas station), turn south on **Main Rd.** Follow Main Rd. all the way to Huntington (7 miles--you will enter a small town with 2 stores/gas stations). Drive through town, and in 6 miles from the village, turn **LEFT** up **Carse Rd.** (dirt road with a single land bridge) A little ways up there is a funky intersection, just stay on Carse. *We are* at the end of the road (1.5 mile). Please park in the area to the between the office/house and telephone pole but not right near the house please.

Spruce Yurt: Once parked in our lot (if you have many vehicles, please stack your cars), you will see a sign marked "Walking Trail to Yurt" on a telephone pole. The trail is between that sign and the sugar shack toward the mountains which eventually curves toward the right, then around to the left to a meadow at the edge of the woods until you see the yurt there! It is about a 5-8 minute walk gradually uphill (see enclosed map). In winter, depending on snowpack on trails, **you will likely need snowshoes or skis to get to the yurt.**

Maple Yurt: Once parked in our lot (if you have many vehicles, please stack your cars), head up through the double red gates above the farmhouse looking at the two wind turbines. Ascend the meadow keeping the towers on your left to the hedgerow. Go through the Green gate and then stay left and you'll find the yurt in the in the woods.

Water: year round is available at spigot outside the barn to the right of the big barn door. The Maple Yurt has a year round spigot just below the yurt. Use our blue jugs but please leave it **EMPTY** for the next folks (especially in winter, the remaining water freezes).

PLEASE NOTE:

You will be driving on Vermont country two lane roads with no streetlights. Be mindful of wildlife! Weather conditions will increase travel times. In the winter, be sure you have 4WD or good all season tires (Carse Road has a steep grade). The closest public phone to On The Loose is 5 miles North on the Huntington Main Road at Jacques Country Store in Huntington. Cell phones may or may not work once you are in the valley.
